World War II Veteran Pete Wiley was presented an honorary diploma by St. Paul Lutheran High School during the commencement ceremony !



Pete Wiley, became St. Paul's first honorary graduate on Sunday. Pete donned a maroon cap and gown, walked the processional with the six graduates, and received a standing ovation upon the receipt of his diploma .He left school at 17 to join the military after the bombing at Pearl Harbor and dedicated his youth to defending unknown citizens against some of the greatest hate the world has ever encountered. He came home from the war and dedicated his life to serving his community in meeting needs as he learned of them. Pete respects education and supports it in our community, and officials at the school said it was the greatest privilege and honor to give to him a modest moiety of the gift he gave to the generations who came after him.
