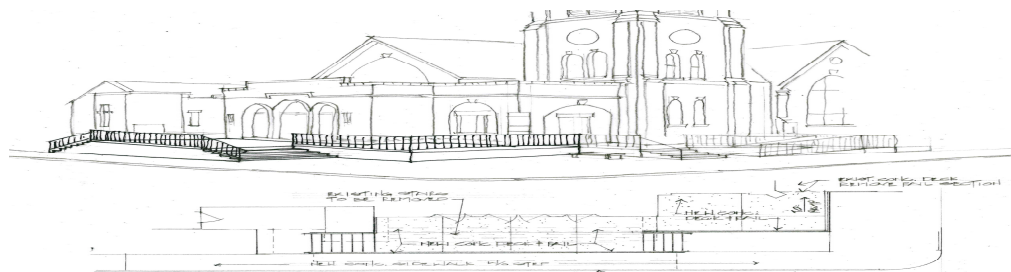
The 25th Annual St. Paul Benefit Auction and Dinner
