

Voters Meeting Update:

Updates were discussed about the Going Beyond campaign and the status of the Transition Team. Senate President Lee Hagen is coming on June 8 to speak with the Transition Team at which point we would become the call committee. Members voted to approve the slate of board members in council members. The new church president for the 2017 2018 fiscal year will be Kraig Sutherland, Vice chair will be Doug Pratt. The council secretary will be Tammy DeGroot. The voters also approved the 2017 2018 proposed budget. Part of the new budget includes a \$1000 increase to teacher salary, retention of HSA account, and including \$10,000 to start a junior and senior youth program with a youth leader. The proposed budget has a \$97,000 surplus. Presently our building fund, as a result of the going beyond campaign, has a \$92,000 surplus.
